ONE FLEW OVER THE CUCKOO'S NEST

Adapted from the novel by: Ken Kesey

A play by: Dale Wasserman

One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest is a narrative study of institution and how it affects the human mind. It is a critique of behaviorism and a tribute to individualistic principles.

This production has several key roles:

- The lead character is the son of Chief Tee Ah Millatoona (The Pine That Stands Tallest on the Mountain) and a white woman, Mary Louise Bromden, who is a dominant force. Chief Bromden bears his mother's last name, but his father's gentle demeanor. He narrates the story of injustice, failure and hope.
- McMurphy represents sexuality, freedom, and self-determination, characteristics that clash with the oppressed ward, which is controlled by Nurse Ratched. McMurphy's sanity contrasts with what Kesey implies is an insane institution. McMurphy becomes an inspiration to Chief.
- Nurse Ratched is the quintessential passive aggressive nurse who flashes her smile while controlling her patients beyond reasonable limits. She sees her job as an autocratic leader without compassion.

There are several other essential characters who are patients on the ward, they encompass many different personality traits; compulsive, insecure, domineering, a follower of others. They help to add an element of humor and congeniality to the play. This story examines the abuses of the system against the individual, and presents inspiration for what the human spirit can overcome and achieve.
